

## So The Wall Was Finished (Nehemiah 6:1-7:4)

The narrative returns to the building of the wall of Jerusalem.

## Read Nehemiah 6:1-14

1. What strategies did Nehemiah's enemies use to try to stop the work on the wall?

- 2. What did they hope Nehemiah would be afraid of? (v9,13) Why did they want to make him afraid?
- 3. How did Nehemiah respond to each attack?
- 4. How did Nehemiah pray?
- 5. Have you ever experienced opposition to the work of the Gospel in your ministry? What strategies did people use? Did you persevere, or give in to fear?

## Read Nehemiah 6:15-7:4

- 6. Once the wall was completed, what was the response of the enemies?
- 7. What suggestions are there of ongoing opposition?
- 8. What qualities did Nehemiah look for in the leaders he appointed?
- 9. Can you think of times when Jesus faced distraction, defamation, or deception as he went about his mission? [See for example Mark 1:32-39; Mark 3:1-6; Mark 3:22-27; Mark 8:31-33; Mark 11:27-28; Hebrews 12:3.]
- 10. How can we encourage one another to keep persevering in Gospel mission?

Bonus: Read 2 Corinthians 6:3-10 for Paul's description of his life in ministry.
