Witness And Woes (Revelation 10-11)

Similar to the interlude between the sixth and seventh seals, between the blowing of the sixth and seventh trumpets John's attention is drawn elsewhere.

Read Revelation 10:1-11

1. Consider the mighty angel
 - a. What does he look like?
 - b. What does he do?
 - c. What does this communicate about his authority?
 - d. What is his message?

Read Revelation 10:8-11

2. For John, what do you think was the significance of being given the scroll to eat? (See also Jeremiah 15:16 and Ezekiel 2:9-3:3)
3. Why do you think it was bitter and sweet?

Read Revelation 11:1-14

4. Regardless of what or who the two witnesses represent, what is their job?
5. What kind of power do they have? (Compare 1 Kings 17:1, Exodus 7:17)

6. What is done to them and why?

7. What is their end?

8. *How are these two witnesses an example and encouragement to the church?*

Read Revelation 11:15-19

9. What happens when the seventh trumpet is blown?

10. Compare the description of God here in verse 17 with Revelation 4:8. Why do you think it is different?

11. Carefully read verse 18. What three things is it time for?

12. Why do you think these events are called a “woe” (Rev 8:13; 11:14)?

13. *What have the visions recorded on chapters 8-11 added to the picture we had from the seven seals?*

14. *How do we live and pray in response to the warnings of judgement contained in these chapters?*
