

Victory Assured (Revelation 19:11-21)

Read Revelation 19:11-16

1.	From the previous verses we might expect to see the bridegroom, or the Lamb (19:7). Who are
	we presented with here?

2.	Each element of this description has been seen before. [Helpful references from Revelation
	include 1:14; 1:16; 2:18; 3:7; and 17:14. Also see Isaiah 63:1-6 and 11:1-5; Hebrews 4:12-13; John
	1:1-3, 14; and Psalm 2.]

Take time to consider the details and discuss what they communicate about Jesus.

3. Who is with Jesus as he rides out to conquer?

Read Revelation 19:17-21

- 4. Who is revealed as the opponent of Jesus?
- 5. What do you notice about the battle?
- 6. What are we told will happen to the beast and the false prophet?
- 7. Jesus didn't need or use the armies of heaven. Why do you think they were there?
- 8. This is a chapter of contrasting pairs two women, two suppers, two armies following two leaders. How do these contrasts help us choose a side? How do they help us stay faithful to Jesus when the beasts seem to be winning?

Bonus:

The prophesy of Ezekiel 38-39 forms a backdrop to Revelation 19 and 20. Take some time to read it and notice how the images are developed in the visions given to John.
